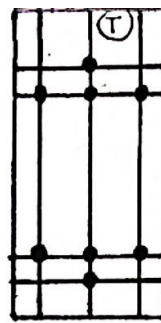


## INSTRUCTIONS FOR PANORAMA BOOK:

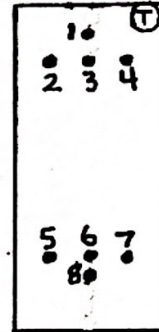
### 1. Make an 8 x 4 template using cardstock weight paper:

- Draw lines dividing paper in half horizontally and vertically
- Draw 2 lines:  $1\frac{1}{4}$ " from either side of the vertical center line
- Draw 2 lines: 2" above and below horizontal center line
- Draw a line  $\frac{1}{2}$ " below the bottom 2" line
- Draw a line  $\frac{1}{2}$ " above the top 2" line
- Label the top of your template by lightly marking a T in the upper right corner

### 2. Pierce template: Using awl, pierce a hole in the 8 junction locations shown Number the pierced holes to match the diagram



### 3. Make a 6 panel accordion with $\frac{3}{4}$ " extensions using 8 x 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sheet

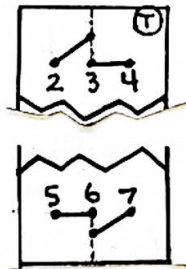
- Label the right side of paper, then flip so the wrong side of paper facing up
- Score a line  $\frac{3}{4}$ " from either end of the paper to create extensions
- Bone firmly so these extensions are folded on top of paper—  
these folded edges are now the 'ends' of the paper, making it 24" long
- Draw lines at 8" and 16"
- Fold paper in thirds (8" each): Bring right edge to the line. Bone, then open  
Bring left edge to the fold line. Bone, then open.  
You now see two valley folds facing up.

Turn paper over so you see two mountain folds ( $\frac{3}{4}$ " extensions are now folded under)  
Bring first mountain fold to the left edge. Bone.  
Repeat with second mountain fold. Bone.  
Repeat with the right edge ( $\frac{3}{4}$ " extension remains folded). Bone.

### 4. Pierce Paper: Place template on folded accordion with $\frac{3}{4}$ " extensions opened at left Using awl, pierce each template hole (8 holes) through entire folded stack

### 5. Score: Open accordion and lay flat. (wrong side facing up).

- Turn valley folds into mountain folds so paper lays flat
- Set template so you can see it easily
- Align ruler with the central awl holes on first panel
- Score from hole #3 to the top of panel
- Score from hole #6 to the bottom of panel
- (Do not score in the center panel area)
- Repeat scoring on remaining panels. (--- = score)



### 6. Cuts from Top Holes: Make these cuts on each panel

- Make diagonal cut from the center upper hole to the hole on the left (1 to 2)
- Make a horizontal cut from the center lower hole to the hole on the right (3 to 4)

### 7. Cuts from Bottom Holes: Make these cuts on each panel

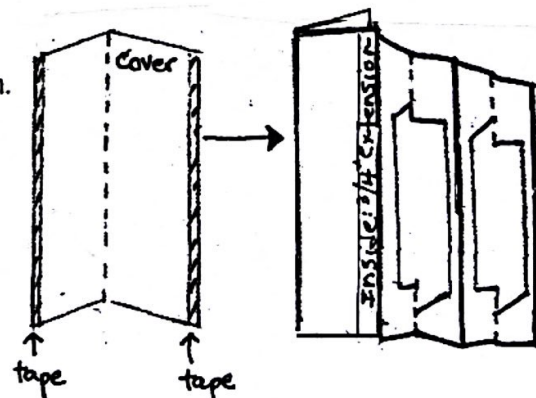
- Make diagonal cut between the center lower hole to the hole on the right (7 to 8)
- Make a horizontal between the center upper hole to the hole on the left (5 to 6)

### 8. Vertical Cuts: Make vertical cuts to create the swinging panels (2 to 5 and 4 to 7)

### 9. Fold and Bone: Starting at left, bring first mountain fold to edge, being careful to not fold the panel. Repeat with remaining mountain folds. Firmly bone these folds. Open and expand to reveal the panels. A small portion of the fold at bottom gets creased and boned to the left to allow panel to swing.

### 10. Make Covers: Fold 8 x 8 cover paper in half. put double-sided tape on both sides of each cover and attach to the front and back of each $\frac{3}{4}$ " extension.

### 11. Embellish to you heart's delight!
